SCORM stands for Sharable Content Object Reference Model, which is a set of specifications that define how content is stored, tracked, and delivered.

AICC standards apply to the development, delivery, and evaluation of training courses that are delivered through a learning management system.

What is the Advance Distributed Learning (ADL) Initiative?

ADL is a government-sponsored organization that was started to develop specifications and promote the use of learning management systems.
