Guarding Against Fraud

Here are some tips to help protect you from credit and charge card fraud.

Do:

- * Sign your cards as soon as they arrive.
- * Carry your cards separately from your wallet, in a zippered compartment, a business card
- * Keep a record of your account numbers, their expiration dates, and the phone number and
- * Keep an eye on your card during the transaction, and get it back as quickly as possible.
- * Void incorrect receipts.
- * Destroy carbons.
- * Save receipts to compare with billing statements.
- * Open bills promptly and reconcile accounts monthly, just as you would your checking acco
- * Report any questionable charges promptly and in writing to the card issuer.
- * Notify card companies in advance of a change in address.

Don't:

- * Lend your card(s) to anyone.
- * Leave cards or receipts lying around.
- * Sign a blank receipt. When you sign a receipt, draw a line through any blank spaces abov
- * Write your account number on a postcard or the outside of an envelope.
- * Give out your account number over the phone unless you're making the call to a company y
