• cooking tools/fuel

• paper plates/plastic utensils

• blankets/pillows, etc.

• clothing-seasonal/rain gear/ sturdy shoes

• first-aid kit/medicines/prescription drugs

• special items for babies and the elderly

• toiletries/hygiene items/moisture wipes

• flashlight/batteries

• radio-battery-operated radio and National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)

• cash-banks and ATMs may not be open for extended periods.

• keys

• photographs

• computer hard drive or laptop

• toys, books and games

• important documents-in a waterproof container including insurance, medical records, be

• tools-keep a set with you during the storm

• vehicle fuel tanks filled

• pet care items

• proper identification/immunization records/medications
