Forms of Drywall

White board'regular. This form of drywall looks appealing, is the cheapest, and is used for the most common applications.

Fire-resistive ("Type X") ~ A bit more expensive, for obvious reasons. This form of drywall has a fire rating of 1/2 hour.

Green Board'washrooms and other high-humidity areas. This form of drywall presumably absorbs moisture.

Drywall Specifications and Types

The standard cut for drywall in the United States and Canada is 4 feet (1220 mm) wide and eight feet (2440 mm) long.

Thickness varies, too. Typically, drywall is from one-half inch (12mm, 12.5 mm, or 12.7 mm) to one inch (25.4 mm) thick.

The United States and Canada together possess the greatest number of gypsum board users in the world.

Drywall is the material for all seasons. This material provides protection and lightweight support for interior walls and ceilings.
