About 55 percent of the member colleges and universities have completed the reporting. The remaining schools will be given a year to complete the reporting.

The NCAA last month released its findings on graduation rates, and it reported 76 percent of Division I schools met the standards.

Colleges will be given yearly assessments. They will have the opportunity to explain unusual circumstances.

The penalties will begin this year and will result in the loss of a scholarship for teams that fail to meet the standards.

The proposal, one of about 140 heard during the NCAA convention, will be sent to member schools for approval.

Under the plan, the two-in-four rule would be eliminated and schools would be allowed to participate in more than one sport.
